Food for the fighters

"Food For Fighters" is raising funds for the provision of 3,000 lunchboxes of fresh food per day for medical staff at several hospitals in Bangkok, Pathum Thani, Nakhon Ratchasima and Chiang Mai. Initiated by the owner of Pen Lao restaurant with collaboration by 30 restaurants, the project can also save restaurant employees from losing their jobs and much-needed daily wage. Each lunchbox includes food and drinks and costs about 50 baht (including delivery services). With the target of 3,000 sets a day for distribution, this means the project needs at least 150,000 baht in funding per day or 4.5 million baht per month. The campaign is running until April 26.
